

## NALOXBOX QUICK INFO SHEET



A NaloxBox is a hard acrylic box mounted to a wall that provides 24/7 access to naloxone, a medication approved to reverse opioid overdose. Installation of NaloxBoxes in public locations, along with other emergency devices such as automated external defibrillators (AEDs), can normalize access to naloxone, which can reduce the stigma often associated with opioid overdose.



Your organization or business is responsible for the overall condition, maintenance, and continued operation of the NaloxBox. Your NaloxBox should be checked monthly and after every use to make sure its contents are organized and that the unit is safe to use. All items that have been used must be replaced as soon as possible. All instances of NaloxBox usage should be reported to DHHS at <u>SORTA@dhhs.nh.gov</u>.



The exact location of your NaloxBox will be recorded and shared with the NH Department of Health and Human Services. Periodically, you will also need to complete a survey about your NaloxBox.
